# 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

Inhalation: Immediately call a poison center or doctor. Move victim to fresh air. Give artificial respiration if victim is not

breathing. Administer oxygen if breathing is difficult. Keep victim warm and quiet. Treat symptomatically

and supportively. Ensure that medical personnel are aware of the material(s) involved and take

precautions to protect themselves.

Skin contact: Immediately call a poison center or doctor. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before re-use. In

case of contact with substance, immediately flush skin with running water for at least 20 minutes. Treat symptomatically and supportively. Ensure that medical personnel are aware of the material(s) involved and

Loosen tight clothing such as a collar, tie, belt or waistband. If a person vomits place them in the recovery position so that vomit will not reenter the mouth and throat. Rinse mouth. Keep victim warm and quiet. Treat symptomatically and supportively. Ensure that medical personnel are aware of the material(s) involved and take precautions to protect

# 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

# 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

# 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

**Emergency procedures:** 

Prevent dust cloud. ELIMINATE all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks or flames in the immediate area). Do not touch damaged containers or spilled material unless wearing appropriate protective clothing. Warn personnel to move away. Prevent entry into sewers, basements or confined areas; dike if needed.

#### Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up:

ELIMINATE all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks, or flames in immediate area). All equipment used when handling the product must be grounded. Stop leak if without risk. Ventilate the area. Absorb with an inert material and put the spilled material in an appropriate waste disposal container. Use clean non-sparking tools to collect absorbed material. Dike far ahead of spill; use dry sand to contain the flow of material.

**Environmental precautions:** 

Keep away from living quarters. Environmental hazard. Do not let product enter drains. Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Water runoff can cause environmental damage. Prevent entry into sewers, basements or confined areas; dike if needed.

#### 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Precautions for safe handling: Avoid inhalation of vapor or mist. Do not ingest. Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Avoid mechanical shock

and friction. Avoid formation of dust and aerosols. Keep away from heat and sources of ignition. Use explosion-proof equipment. Use only non-sparking hand tool when handling this product. Ground all equipment containing material. Take measures to prevent build up of electrostatic charge. Good general ventilation should be sufficient to control airborne levels. Keep container dry.
